3.1	The abstract of the article should not exceed 200 words (excluding the keyword	[]
	component).	
3.2	The structure of the submitted abstract is consistent with the type of article submitted for	[]
	submission (research, review and reflection articles).	
3.3	The abstract must be submitted in a language other than the main language, being	[]
	mandatory in English (except for articles submitted in English, which must include an	
	abstract in Spanish).	
3.4	Between 4 and 6 keywords that have been obtained from one of the Thesauri	[]
	recommended by the Journal in the template for article submission are listed.	
3.5	A footnote refers to the source from which the keywords related to the article have been	[]
	obtained in the summary section.

4.1	The article presents the specific sections required by Pensamiento Americano according	[]

5.1	The bibliographic references of the article are organized according to the instructions established by the APA Norms in their latest edition in force.	[]
5.2	Thirty percent of the total bibliographic references in the article correspond to literature in English.	[]
5.3	Anachronistic bibliographic references are used for the date of submission of the article only when necessary. Otherwise, the rule of using references with a maximum publication window of 5 years is respected.	[]
5.4	The bibliographic references of the article correspond to materials of scientific rigor, giving preference to articles published in indexed scientific journals, books, book chapters and conference proceedings.	[]
5.5	In the case of using bibliographic references from Internet sites, these shall correspond to recognized sources (publishing houses, think tanks, governmental or Non-Governmental Organizations' sites) and shall not exceed 15% of the total number of references used in the article.	[]
